Teams may consist of non-exhibitors (friends and family) and other animals may be exhibited individually or in the team as long as they are on a 6 ft leash.

Rules and Regulations

1. Windermere Equestrian Center, Inc., will not be responsible in any way for loss or damage to any person, animal, property, or equipment and each exhibitor shall assume all liability and hold harmless Windermere Equestrian Center for any loss, damage, or injury to any person, animal or equipment that may be caused by any horse or pony entered by them or due to carelessness or negligence of the persons in charge of such animal or any of their subordinates or superiors.
2. All entry forms must be signed by the owner or an authorized agent, trainer, and parent (if applicable). The entry must be accompanied by a check for all fees. Checks should be made payable to "Windermere Equestrian Center".
3. Entries close 6:00 p.m. Friday, October 14, 2016. You will be charged for stall cancellations after this time. There will be a \$25.00 post entry fee per entry after this time if the exhibitor has not already opened an entry. No entries will be taken over the phone. Any trainer or exhibitor who cancels all of their stalls will be charged for them regardless of the date. The horse show office will open one hour before the start of each show day and will be open at 12:00 p.m. on Schooling day.
4. Stall fees are \$70.00. First bedding is not provided, but shavings are available upon request (\$9.00/bag in advance - \$10.00/bag if ordered at the show). Reservations are accepted on a 'first pay, first serve basis.' Stalls will not be reserved without a check. Stabling consists of 10 x 10 slated wood stalls with nylon stall guards. Stalls will be available at 9:00 a.m. Friday. Horses coming in early must make arrangements with the management.

Call Jennifer (586) 465-2170 for stall reservations & shavings order.

5. Stall fees are not refundable under any circumstance.

6. Entry fees are \$22.00 for MHJA recognized classes and their associated warm ups; \$24.00 for Medal Class; \$30.00 for Hunter Classic; and \$12.00 for Lead Line and Walk/Trot classes. All prize money will be deducted from entries. Prize money exceeding entry fees will be mailed to the owner of record unless otherwise directed within 30 days.
7. There will be a \$5.00 "Rode not Entered" fee for riders who add a class without filling out an add slip with the secretary. Exhibitors DO NOT add or scratch at the gate!!
8. There will be a \$25.00 grounds fee for horses showing out of trailers.
9. **Non-Showing horses will be charged \$45.00 in addition to the stall fee.**
10. A Processing fee of \$50.00 plus collection fees will be made for any non-negotiable checks. Social Security numbers are required to receive stakes money.
11. Payment may be made by cash, check or credit card. Credit card payments incur a 3% non-cash fee.

12. Horses entered may be scratched by written notice presented or mailed to the horse show. No veterinarian's certificate is required. This written notice must be in the possession of the show secretary one hour prior to the first class(es) involved. When valid notice of a scratch is received, the entry fee(s) will be refunded or credited to the entry. Once the class or classes have started, horses which are not shown and have not presented a valid notice of scratch to the show secretary forfeit their fees. Failure to comply with these rules will result in a forfeiture of entry fees. No refunds on stalls after closing date.

EXHIBITORS – PLEASE DO YOUR PAPERWORK.

13. Protective Headgear: All riders must wear a secured ASTM/SEI approved riding helmet while mounted anywhere on the show grounds (adults and Professionals included). Any rider violating this rule will be immediately prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Windermere Equestrian Center and the MHJA make no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that serious injury may result despite wearing protective headgear as all equestrian sports involve an intrinsic element of risk.

14. Please be aware that it is illegal to show a tranquilized horse. Although the MHJA does not drug test at our shows, it is still not permitted. Showing a tranquilized horse is unfair to the other competitors, bad for business, and most of all dangerous to the horse and rider! If you are concerned that someone is giving their horse illegal meds, please talk to show management or a member of the RSG committee.

15. Management reserve the right to combine, divide or cancel classes if entries warrant, or to refuse any entry.

16. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and regulations of the MHJA rulebook and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

17. Schooling will be permitted after 9:00 a.m. on Friday and until 1/2 hour prior to commencement the days of the show. No Schooling after 8:30 p.m. in any ring.

18. In some classes the area of the courtesy circle may be restricted by a mandatory line. This line will be indicated on the course diagram and physically in the ring.

19. Championships will be offered in all Hunter and Equitation divisions.

20. **IMPORTANT: NO EXHIBITOR MAY PARTICIPATE IN A RECOGNIZED MHJA C CIRCUIT DIVISION IF THEY HAVE JUMPED IN ANY CLASSES THAT REQUIRE THE RIDER TO JUMP HIGHER THAN STATED IN THE CLASS RESTRICTIONS. JUMPING HIGHER THAN THE RESTRICTED DIVISION HEIGHT MAKES A RIDER IMMEDIATELY INELIGIBLE TO COMPETE IN THAT DIVISION.**

Awards

Ribbons for first through sixth places per class will be presented at each show. The Hunter Classic will place through tenth. Champion and Reserve awards will be given for all divisions offering over fences classes.

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

GENERAL

A rider who is eligible to compete in a division at the start of the show year will remain eligible to compete in that division for the remainder of the show year regardless of the # of blue ribbons he/she may have won. Winning 15 USEF Points will make a rider IMMEDIATELY INELIGIBLE for certain divisions.

“C” CIRCUIT CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted.

WARM UP CLASSES –Open to all Horses and riders.

VERY GREEN HUNTER –

Open to horses in their first year or second year of showing over fences. Horses may cross enter into the Regular member Baby Green Hunter division. Horses may show in baby green/very green for two show seasons and after that will be ineligible to compete in either division the following show season. Fence Heights: 2'3" - 2'6"

PRIMARY JUNIOR/ADULT HUNTER –

Open to Junior/Adult riders who have not won 6 Blue Ribbons in any hunter classes over fences. Competing in any classes 2'9" or higher will make a rider immediately ineligible to compete in this division. Ribbons won in over fences classes DO affect a rider's eligibility on the flat. Ribbons won in MHJA junior classes DO affect an adult rider's eligibility. Fence Heights: 2'3"

INTERMEDIATE JUNIOR/ADULT HUNTER –

Open to Junior/Adult riders who have not won 9 Blue Ribbons in any hunter classes over fences. Competing in any classes 3' or higher will make a rider immediately ineligible to compete in this division. Ribbons won in over fences classes DO affect a rider's eligibility on the flat. Ribbons won in MHJA junior classes DO affect an adult rider's eligibility. Fence Heights: 2'6"

BEGINNER JUNIOR/ADULT HUNTER –

Open to Junior/Adult riders who have not won 3 Blue Ribbons in a recognized hunter class at MHJA, MHSA or USEF shows prior to October 1 of the preceding year. Riders do retain their Beginner status for the current show season. This Rule to supersede all other rules. Riders having won in the Beginner Junior/Adult division do not lose their Novice, Primary or Short Stirrup status. This division is not open to any riders who have shown in any Open Hunter or Equitation divisions at MHJA, MHSA or USEF Pony or Regular Member shows. Riders may not cross enter into any division that require jumping 2'6" or higher. Jumping 2'6" or higher will make a rider immediately ineligible for this division. Ribbons won in MHJA junior classes DO affect an adult rider's eligibility. No oxers or In & Out. Fence Heights: 2'

BEGINNER JUNIOR/ADULT EQUITATION –

Open to Junior/Adult riders who have not won 3 Blue Ribbons in a recognized equitation class at MHJA, MHSA or USEF shows prior to October 1 of the preceding year. Riders do retain their Beginner status for the current show season. This Rule to supersede all other rules. Riders having won in the Beginner Adult or Junior division do not lose their Novice, Primary or Short Stirrup status. Ribbons won in equitation on the flat classes DO NOT affect a rider's eligibility in equitation over fences classes. However, ribbons won in equitation over fences classes DO affect a rider's eligibility on the flat. Ribbons won in MHJA junior classes DO affect an adult rider's eligibility. This division is not open to any riders who have shown in any Open Hunter or Equitation divisions at MHJA, MHSA or USEF Pony or Regular member shows. Riders may not cross enter into any divisions that require jumping 2'6" or higher. Jumping 2'6" or higher will make a rider immediately ineligible for this division. No oxers or In & Out. Fence Heights: 2'

PRIMARY JUNIOR/ADULT EQUITATION -

Open to Junior/Adult riders who have not won 6 Blue Ribbons in any equitation classes. Ribbons won in Equitation on the Flat classes do not affect a rider's eligibility in Equitation Over Fences classes. However, ribbons won in Equitation Over Fences classes do affect a rider's eligibility in Equitation on the Flat classes. Ribbons won in MHJA junior classes DO affect an adult rider's eligibility. Competing in any classes 2'9" or higher will make a rider immediately ineligible for this division. Fence Heights: 2'3"

INTERMEDIATE JUNIOR/ADULT EQUITATION -

Open to Junior/Adult riders who have not won 9 Blue Ribbons in any equitation classes. Ribbons won in Equitation on the Flat classes do not affect a rider's eligibility in Equitation Over Fences classes. However, ribbons won in Equitation Over Fences classes do affect a rider's eligibility in Equitation On the Flat classes. Ribbons won in MHJA junior classes DO affect an adult rider's eligibility. Competing in any classes 3' or higher will make a rider immediately ineligible to compete in this division. Fence Heights: 2'6"

MHJA INTERMEDIATE JUNIOR MEDAL -

Open to all current MHJA Junior Members in good standing who have not won 9 Blue Ribbons in any equitation classes over fences. Competing in any classes 3' or higher will make a rider immediately ineligible to compete in this Medal. To qualify for the final Medal Ride-Off a rider must win one Blue Ribbon or one Red Ribbon in a qualifying class. Riders winning two Blue Ribbons are then ineligible to compete in the qualifying classes. Riders winning one Red Ribbon may continue to compete in the qualifying classes until they win a Blue Ribbon. To be shown over a figure eight course of not less than six fences, which must include one combination and two changes of direction. Four competitors must complete the course. Tests 1-8. MHJA Qualifying Medal & 6 Ribbons. Fence Heights: 2'6"

MHJA INTERMEDIATE ADULT MEDAL -

Open to amateur riders ONLY, who have not won 9 Blue Ribbons in any equitation class and are current MHJA members in good standing. Ribbons won in MHJA junior classes DO affect an adult rider's eligibility. Competing in any class 3' or higher will immediately make a rider ineligible to compete in this Medal. The top 15 point accumulators in this class during the season will qualify to compete in the Medal Finals. Fence Heights: 2'6"

MHJA JUNIOR/ADULT MINI MEDAL -

Open to Junior/Adult riders who have not won 3 Blue Ribbons in a recognized Equitation class at MHJA, MHSA, or USEF shows prior to October 1 of the preceding year. Ribbons won in equitation on the flat classes DO NOT affect a rider's eligibility in equitation over fences classes. However, ribbons won in equitation over fences classes DO affect a rider's eligibility on the flat. Ribbons won in MHJA junior classes DO affect an adult rider's eligibility. Riders do retain their status for the current show season. Riders having won do not lose their Novice, Primary, or Short Stirrup status. This division is not open to any riders who have shown in any Open Hunter or Equitation divisions at MHJA, MHSA, USEF Pony or Regular Member shows. Riders may not cross enter into any divisions that require jumping 2'6" or higher. Jumping 2'6" or higher will make a rider immediately ineligible for this class. Top 15 point accumulators in this class during the season will qualify to compete in the Medal Finals. 1/2 points will be awarded if there are less than 3 competitors. No oxers or In & Out. Fence Heights: 2'

MHJA CROSS POLE HUNTER & EQUITATION - Riders must be in their first or second year of showing. Lead line, walk/trot, and pole pile divisions do not count. Riders may cross enter into the short stirrup and beginner divisions only, and for one season only. Fence Heights: Cross pole





Unrecognized Class Descriptions

Multiple riders will be permitted on the same horse. Riders may cross enter into the beginner division.

LEAD LINE –Informal attire permitted. Riders will be asked to walk and halt on a lead line. They may be asked to demonstrate the two-point or be asked a simple question.

WALK/TROT – Beginner walk trot diagonals do not count. Advanced walk trot diagonals count. Informal attire permitted. Advanced entrants may cross over into Beginner Walk/Trot/Canter. Riders may cross enter into the Pole Pile over fences classes, but must do so at the trot. Not MHJA recognized.

BEGINNER WALK/TROT/CANTER –Entrants will walk and trot together, and canter individually. Leads do not count. Informal attire permitted. Not MHJA recognized.

POLE PILE HUNTER & EQUITATION –Informal attire permitted. Open to non-professional riders of any age. Courses will consist of 6 to 8 pole piles. Riders may cross enter into Walk/Trot. Not MHJA recognized.

LOW HUNTER & EQUITATION –Low hunter classes are open to all riders of any experience, including professionals.. Low equitation classes are open to non-professional riders of any experience. Fence Heights: 2'6" – 2'9"

NOVICE JUMPER -- Fence dimensions 2' - 2'3" in height and 2'6" – 2'9" in width. Open to non-professional riders who have not competed over fences exceeding 2'6 in height. Open to all tables except table II.1a and table III.

LEARNER JUMPER – Fence dimension 2'6" in height and 2'6" – 2'9" in width, Open to non-professional riders who have not competed over fences greater than 3" greater than there entered division. Open to all tables except table II.1a and table III.

ADDISON MEMORIAL HUNTER CLASSIC

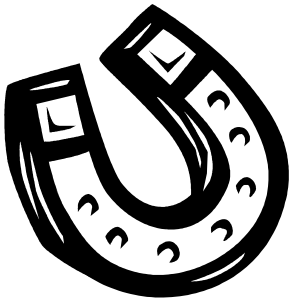
Entry Fee \$40.00. Open to horses and ponies who have entered, shown and completed the course in at least two classes over fences in this show. Also, riders in this class must be eligible to show in recognized "C" Circuit or pony classes. Each competitor will jump one round over a course of 9-12 fences. Lines will be set on a 12' stride. The judge will use their discretion to determine the appropriate strides for the various horses and ponies entered. The top twelve riders with the highest first round scores will return to jump a second round over a different course. The Classic will be offered at three heights: 2', 2'3", and 2'6". First round 2' goes first, 2'3" goes second, and 2'6" goes third. For the second round, 2'6" goes first, 2'3" goes second, and 2' goes third. The classic will be held in both show arenas if weather permits. Prize money is 50% entry fees split between the top six places. Not MHJA recognized.

The first and second round scores will be added together, and the competitors will be placed in order of their total score. ORDER OF GO will be drawn and posted for the first round at least one hour prior to the class. Adds will go first at their declared height. Formal Classic Attire will not be required, however, each competitor must be suitably dressed (no chaps, etc.). Professional riders will receive a set point deduction to be determined by the judge.

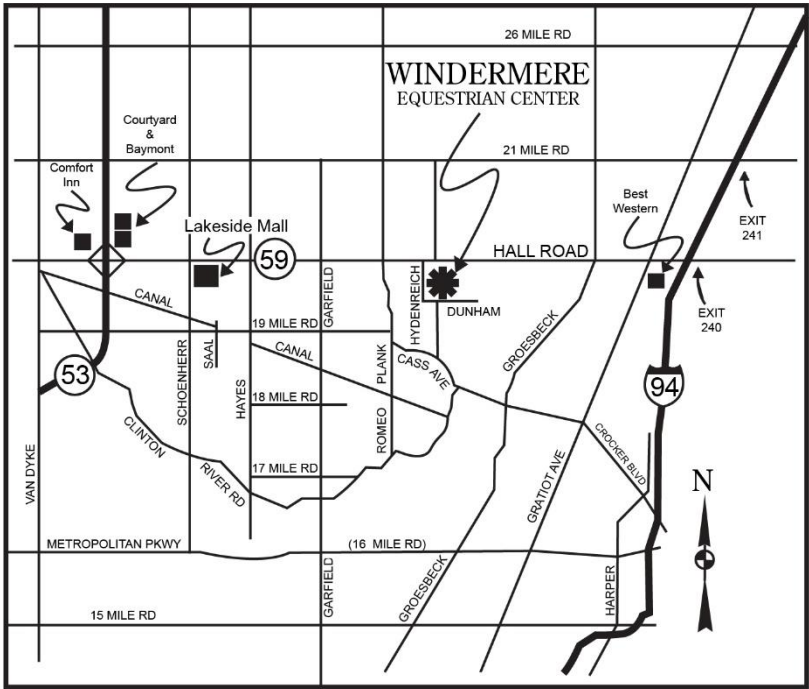
